Liverpool legends remembered

January was a month of recalling some fabled Reds. Legendary manager Bob Paisley was born 105 years ago on 23 January in the village of Hetton-le-Hole, near Sunderland. In his nine years as boss he won 20 trophies, including six league titles and three European Cups.

A memorial to the great man was unveiled in his home town in 2008 and the SOS coach always makes a point of stopping off en-route to games in the North East.

We also remembered Paul Rice, founding member and chair of SOS, who passed away 12 years ago on 21 January. Much loved and sorely missed, Paul gave so much for SOS, the club and the city he adored. His memory lives on in all we do.





Thank you and RIP Harry

Reds fan Harry Woodroffe sadly passed away on 20 January at the age of 13 - his mum and dad David and Jacqui, and little brother Oscar by his side. Harry was incredibly brave throughout the 18 months since his diagnosis of a brain tumour and right to the end was looking out for his mum, dad and brother.

Before the Nottingham Forest game last October, SOS and LFC arranged for Harry and his family to meet Jürgen and the players. Harry's family sent the following message to us:

"I would like to thank everyone who was involved that day from the bottom of our hearts. That day meant so much to Harry to meet his heroes at Liverpool, the fact meeting the players and Jürgen was one of the things we were able to do via yourselves, in his short but exceptional lifetime, is huge comfort to us all.

"If you could also please pass on a further huge thank you to Trent Alexander-Arnold, who took time for a picture with Harry and Oscar, Trent also sent a Birthday message a week later – I didn't think I could love that guy anymore but I do... and thank you whoever arranged that message in the background.

"All the players, staff and SOS as a whole have been immense and I have personally have never been prouder to be a Liverpool fan. One last thing I am not sure if you can do but if you can please win the league for my forever fellow red Harry Woodroffe."

Management Committee focus: *Mohan Singh Randhawa*


Elected to the MC in 2021, Mohan is lead on the Equality, Diversity and Inclusion group and a member of the Supporters Board. Born in Birmingham, and British-Asian, he is the first Sikh to be on the MC and the first disabled member.

Mohan's personal experiences have equipped him well to take up members' issues and he is currently working with the club and LDSA to find a solution to storing mobility aids for our supporters and helping individual fans, including a 92-year-old woman.

Mohan says: "I wanted to get involved in SOS to make a difference. Before I stood for election I got to know John Nicholson, who was helping me as a member of SOS with ticketing and diversity matters. I have huge respect for John, who suggested I stand for the MC.

"It's an honour to be involved with Spirit of Shankly and I enjoy helping other Liverpool fans. John and I helped start the newsletter and I'm also involved in the Constitution sub-group. In 2022, I organised the LFC Foundation match between ex-military Reds and SOS MC at Melwood. I've also been involved in SOS recruitment drive days before matches at pubs around the stadium.

"My love for LFC started when I was a kid. Bob Paisley was manager and my favourite player was Kenny Dalglish. When I was a teenager, I started going to watch us at Anfield in the late 80s, and later I got a season ticket on the Kop. I love Liverpool, the city, and the people, who welcomed me with open arms as a shy 16-year-old who walked into a new city on my own. I was humbled by the love of the people of the city and wrote a letter that was published in the *Liverpool Echo* in 2001."
