

The response from young people attending was uplifting.




# **Meet Peggy**

Liverpool season ticket holder and SOS member Peggy Pickavant has been going to Anfield for almost eight decades - here she shares her most cherished Anfield memories - including meeting her future husband on the Kop.

"I was one of the first women on the Kop. I was 14 and thought I'd go to the football because I'd find a fella there!" says Peggy, now 92. "I went to Everton first, they were shut because Liverpool were playing at home. So I went to Anfield and the Kop. It was ninepence to get in.

"There was a group of eight women and in the middle was a little old lady in a red coat down to her toes. She said, 'Come and stand here with us. So I did. Another lady in the group, behind the goal, used to bring a



flask of tea, sugar, and milk, and cups. I met Tommy on the Kop and I was in love with Liverpool, too."

The Kop romance blossomed and Peggy and Tommy married and had six children. Peggy lost her husband after more than 59 years together, but he is never far from her memory at Anfield.

"I love singing Scouser Tommy and You'll Never Walk Alone - I look up at the sky and sing it to Tommy."

Today, Peggy goes to the match with her sons Malcolm, above, and Graham, but it's not an easy journey. She's now in a wheelchair, which she stores in the Fans Supporting Foodbanks van during the game and then has to walk to her seat in the Main Stand. She is on a waiting list for a wheelchair space in the ground.

"I've been getting help from SOS reps, who've been brilliant and the situation reminds me of when I was a teenager on the Kop. We campaigned for women's loos to be installed and got them - hopefully I'll get a wheelchair seat soon!"

Peggy has seen all six of Liverpool's European Cup wins and her and Tommy travelled everywhere to watch her beloved Reds.

"I've got 12 grandchildren, 22 great grandchildren and nine great-great grandchildren. But I've been watching Liverpool for 78 years and I'm so committed I say to my kids if any of you get married when Liverpool are at home, I won't go to your wedding. I love Liverpool."

#### The Kop's Last Stand anniversary

On 30 April, it will be 30 years since the last match in front of an all-standing Kop. The Reds played Norwich in the final home game of the 1993/94 season and the old stand was awash with flags and banners showcasing our illustrious history.

And it's time to dig out the old flags and silkies again as fanzine RAOTL and Spion Kop 1906 are organising a flag day when we play Tottenham on 5 May.

Spion Kop 1906 posted on social media: "The close of the season sees the 30th Anniversary of the Kop's Last Stand, the culmination of the initial Kop Flag Days. The world's most famous standing terrace was about to be lost and its passing could not be allowed to go uncelebrated.

"The Kop never looked finer. To commemorate this we intend to resurrect the Flag Day idea as a way of sending Jürgen Klopp off into the future with all our best wishes, admiration and love.

"So if you have a flag or banner, bring it along. Wear that old scarf or hat you usually save for Finals. Let's make The Kop and Anfield look the part for one of Liverpool's finest ever servants.

"Danke Jürgen. Wir lieben dich. We are so glad that you were a Red!"




#### Keeper Sweeper launch

# Drop-in advice service extended

The weekly advice sessions at Homebaked organised by SOS in partnership with Vauxhall Community Law and Information Centre have been extended and will be available each Monday between 9.30am and 3pm.

Experts will be on hand to help and support with benefit, debt, and housing issues.

In the five months to the end of March, 42 people were helped at the morning advice service with £278,987 secured in financial gains - made up of welfare benefit applications advised by Vauxhall Law Centre and a result of funding from SOS.
