Farewell to two legends

Over the past few weeks, two of Shankly's legends have left us.

In September, Ron Yeats, our first captain to lift the FA Cup and the player Shanks called a Colossus passed away, aged 86.

Ron played 454 games for the Reds, before returning later to work as a chief scout.

His funeral took place at St Mary's Church in West Derby.

On 11 October, Peter Cormack died, aged 78. Peter moved to Anfield from Nottingham Forest in 1972 and went on to win two league titles, a UEFA Cup and FA Cup during a four-year spell with the club.

Jimmy was a great supporter of SOs and some of our members, along with his family, made the trip, where they were joined by Barbara Alexander, Shankly's niece.

Stop Exploiting Loyalty

SOS and Liverpool fans joined West Ham supporters in solidarity at a protest before the recent Carabao Cup fixture. The stand was against the London's club's pricing policy and withdrawal of concessions and is part of a national campaign.

Andy Payne, joint secretary of Hammers United said: "As football fans, we understand the game should be accessible to everyone, regardless of age or physical ability. That's why standing together with Liverpool fans was so important.

"It's not just about West Ham or Liverpool, but about protecting the rights of all supporters. Removing concessions for the elderly and disabled goes against the spirit of the game, which is built on community and inclusion.

"We're proud to have stood in solidarity with our fellow fans, showing that unity can be a powerful force for change."
